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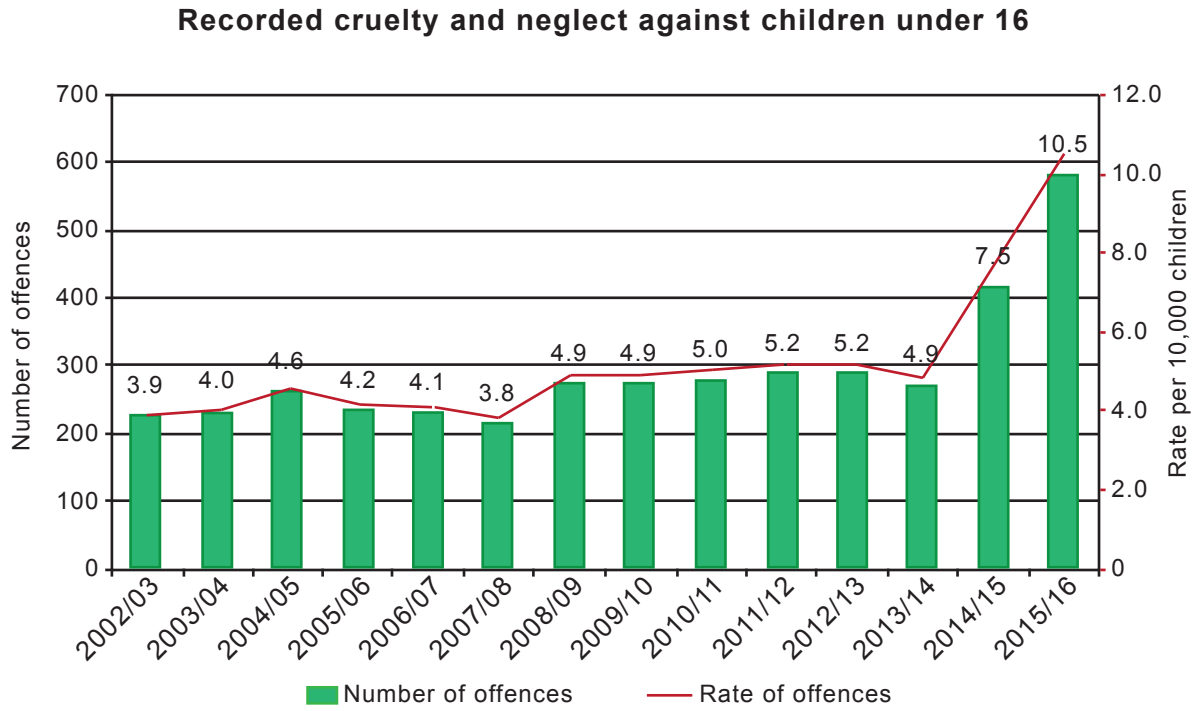
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6. There are many issues affecting the health and well-being of individuals in Wales. The graph below shows the recorded cruelty and neglect against children under 16.
