INFORMATION FOR CANDIDATES

The information overleaf is provided to assist your preparation for Section A in the Theoretical perspectives of adult behaviour examination.

The context for Section A in the Unit 5 examination in summer 2022 is outlined below:

Ioan is 45 years old and a social worker. His mother had a history of alcohol dependency which caused his parents' relationship to break up. His father left home when Ioan was 7 years old. Ioan's mother struggled to manage on state benefits, and Ioan and his brother were often hungry.

Ioan left home at 16 and moved into a hostel. He worked hard and eventually qualified as a social worker. He does not blame his parents for the decisions they made and feels they were victims of their own circumstances. His mother never dealt with her alcohol dependency and, like his grandmother, died prematurely.

Ioan has recently helped his local community to set up a food bank to support those who are in need.

In preparation for Section A in the Unit 5 examination paper, you are advised to investigate:

- factors that affect the behaviour of adults
- the importance and effects of resilience in dealing with care settings and situations
- key theories associated with the understanding and management of specific behaviours
- key approaches in practice which relate to adult development and behaviour.
